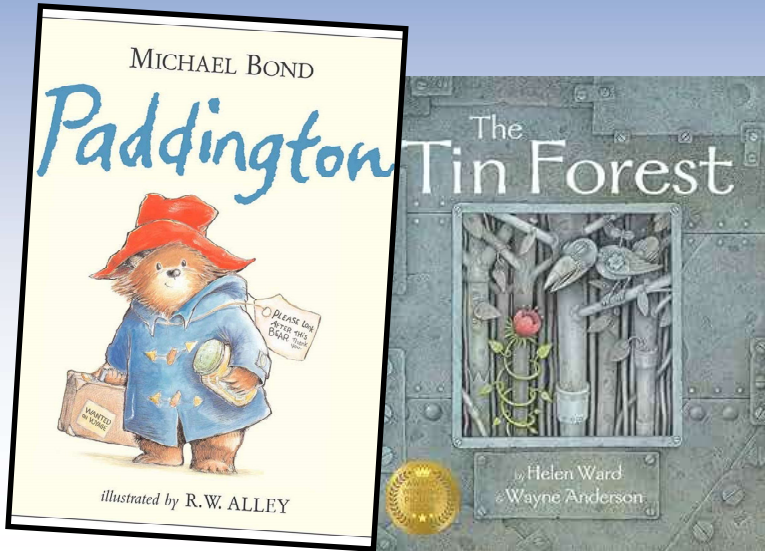
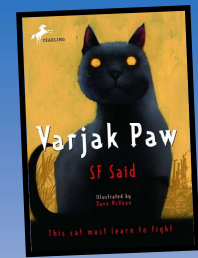
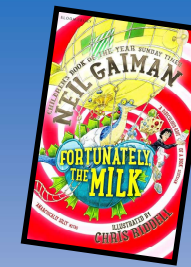

AS CREATORS WE ARE...

ART: Gestural Drawing with Charcoal—The children will discover how to make drawings that capture a sense of drama or performance using charcoal—they're not trying to draw things exactly as they look, but trying to convey emotion.

DESIGN TECHNOLOGY: Mechanical Systems—Pneumatic Toys

Harnessing the power of air, we will create toys that move and perhaps even scare!

AS MATHEMATICIANS WE ARE...

This term we will be focusing upon the core skills of place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. These form the basis for all of the maths, this year and beyond.

AS READERS AND WRITERS...

We are writing our own Paddington story, in which he means well but things don't quite go to plan! We'll also be creating information posters for landmarks in London.

We will be exploring folk tales and then writing alternative versions, as well as reading, analysing and creating biographies.

AS INVESTIGATORS WE ARE...

SCIENCE: Animals Including Humans—Nutrition and healthy diets, types of skeleton, the bones of the human body and how muscles help us move.

Rocks—Types, formation and properties of rock, fossils and soil

AS ENQUIRERS WE ARE...

GEOGRAPHY: The UK

Location and make-up of the United Kingdom. Lots of map and atlas work to locate counties, cities, rivers, the highest point in each of the four countries, and more.

HISTORY: Stone Age to Iron Age

What was life in Britain like in Britain during the Stone Age? How did this change through the Bronze Age into the Iron?

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Christianity (Church) - How do people decide what to believe?

Hinduism—Why is family an important part of Hindu life?

AS COMMUNICATORS WE ARE...

COMPUTING: Computing systems and networks

—What are the essential parts of a computer, a network and the internet—and what do they do?

LANGUAGES: La fonética and Aprendo español—Children will begin their Spanish learning with phonics and pronunciation.

AS YOUNG PEOPLE WE ARE...

PSHE: Me and My Relationships—the importance of formal and informal rules, how to care for others and ensure our friendships are healthy.
